



Clark County SWCD Seeks Candidates for Supervisor Position

The Clark County Soil and Water Conservation District is looking for persons with an interest in natural resources management who would like to serve as a district official. Candidates are being sought for an elected seat on the district's five-member board of supervisors. Term of office runs from January 2017 through January 2020.

Activities of the district are directed by the five supervisors. three who are elected by the local landusers and two appointed by the State Soil Conservation Board. The supervisors plan and oversee the efforts aimed at fulfilling the district's responsibilities, which include: assessing natural resources management needs within the county; developing and implementing policies and programs that address those assessed needs: carrying out program initiative given to SWCDs by state and federal government (e.g., the review of farm conservation plans and construction site erosion/sediment control plans and the inspection of landfills for erosion control); and advising local government on natural resource management issues.

Candidates for Clark County SWCD's elected-supervisor position must be of voting age, must be an occupier of a tract of land located in Clark County and must maintain permanent residence within the county. Invasive Species Spotlight

Garlic Mustard

Alliaria petiolata (Bieb.) Cavara & Grande Synonym: hedge garlic, poor man's mustard, mustard root

Garlic mustard is a biennial herb. It begins as a rosette of kidney-shaped garlic-smelling leaves in the first year. The second-year plants grow a stem up to 4-feet tall with triangular sharp-toothed leaves and small, white, four-petaled flowers in clusters at the top of the stem. The plants die after setting seed. Garlic mustard can produce several thousand seeds from one plant, and the seeds can remain viable for seven years or more. Garlic mustard can grow in dense stands covering many acres of forest understory. Now found throughout Indiana, it is a particular threat to spring wildflowers, overtopping and shading them out. Compared to the diversity of plants it eliminates, it provides little food for wildlife.

State Nurseries Offering Tree Seedlings

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR)-Division of Forestry, operates two nurseries within the state that grow and distribute to landowners high quality plant materials for conservation plantings. Conservation plantings include plantings for timber, wildlife, windbreaks, soil and water protection, reclamation, carbon sequestering, and education. Individual tree species are available as packets of 100 seedlings; packet mixes of seedlings (10 each) are also available according to planned use (i.e., wildlife, bottomland, etc.).

Orders are accepted October 3, 2016—May 1, 2017 (depending on inventory) for standard spring pickup. Order forms are available at the SWCD office; online orders may be placed beginning October 3rd at www.INForestryX.com.
