

# Deadline Information

Interested parties need to complete an application and a ranking form for cost-share assistance.

Property must be located in Clark or Jefferson County of Indiana.

Receipts, seed tags and other documents need to be submitted for payment as soon as the practices are completed.

All practices must be completed within the same calendar year as the application was approved. Except for the year 2020 and all practices have to be complete and receipts submitted for payment by November 30, 2020.

There will be an initial planning visit to determine needs. A final field visit is required to sign off on completion before a cost-share claim can be submitted.

Applications will be ranked and will be approved by Grant Committee before cost-share will be paid.

The Grant Committee will review applications periodically throughout the grant period.

## Clean Water Indiana 2018

The Clark and Jefferson County SWCD's have been awarded a 2018 Clean Water Indiana grant. This grant is for \$66,990 for up to a three year period for the two county area or until the money is allocated. This project will strive to promote soil health on pasture/hay land, and improve water quality. Conservation practices will be installed that help to:

- improve pasture and hay quality;
- reduce soil erosion and compaction;
- reduce excessive nutrients and sediments in surface and ground water; and improve inadequate feed, forage, and water.

Cover crops are included as they reduce erosion and diminish sediment entering our waters, and they can be grazed as part of a pasture management plan.

**Maximum total payment is \$2,500 per participant.**

## Eligible Conservation Practices and Incentive Payments

Heavy Use Area Protection (HUAP)	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$1.60/sq. ft.
Access Road	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$12.00/ft.
Pipeline	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$2.00/ft.
Watering Facility	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$1,000
Cover Crop	Actual cost not to exceed \$20/acre
Roof Runoff Structure	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$8/ft.
Animal Trails and Walkways	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$12/ft.
Permanent Interior Fence	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$4/ft.
Underground Outlet	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$2.50/ft.
*Pasture/Hay Seeding (New Establishments)	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$300/acre
*Pasture/Hay Inter-seeding	60% of actual cost not to exceed \$150/acre

\* These practices are a local district program and are funded by your County's SWCD funds.
